## If you can't decide which hotel or resort...

then we would recommend the **Hyatt Regency** in the resort of Taba Heights!

**Why?** In many ways it is the perfect hotel - set right on the beach, excellent facilities, beautifully designed, and in a stunning location between the Sinai Mountains and the Red Sea, conveniently placed for Taba Heights village. Plus out of all the hotels we offer in Egypt, this gets the most repeat customers, so they must be doing something right! And last but not least, its half board package is outstanding value for money.



## But I would prefer: All Inclusive



If you're happy with the resort of **Taba Heights** - a chill out resort rather than a shops / bars / nightclubs style resort - then probably the best all inclusive hotel is the **Sofitel (pictured on the left)**, again right on the beach and in the same stunning location. Otherwise the **Movenpick** in **Taba** is equally luxurious but a bit cheaper as it is further away from Taba Heights village.

We can also recommend the **Hilton Shark's Bay** in **Sharm el Sheikh** which has an excellent reputation. This is a different type of resort as you will have access to lively nightlife, shops, numerous bars, and even a bowling alley and ice-rink.



## But I would prefer: More Luxury



We recommend either the **Hyatt Regency** in **Sharm el Sheikh** or the **Oberoi in Hurghada (pictured on left)**, depending on the sort of holiday you prefer. The Hyatt Regency is known for its souk with several excellent restaurants, traditional shops and great atmosphere, while the Oberoi is a very tranquil hotel with just 102 rooms, all of which are suites.

## But I would prefer: Something Cheaper

The best value resort is Taba Heights so it makes sense to look there for a good deal, but at various times many of the good 4 & 5 star hotels in Sharm el Sheikh have offers which are quite attractive. However although they will work out cheaper, they would usually be for bed and breakfast only, rather than half board which you get at the Hyatt Regency in Taba Heights. So a couple of suggestions are the **Seastar** in Taba (pictured on the right) or the **Sierra** in Sharm el Sheikh, both 4\* hotels with good feedback.



## Frequently Asked Questions

### Q. Which airports do you fly from?

A. Gatwick or Manchester

### Q. Can you go for 10 nights?

A. No - only 7 or 14 nights are possible

### Q. Where do you recommend for families?

A. The **Sofitel** in Taba Heights has a very good kids club, is very child friendly and right on the beach in Taba Heights which means there are no roads to cross as in other resorts. They also have family suites (at a supplement) which means that the kids can be in a separate twin interconnecting room and there is a lounge area with sofa, table, big TV and terrace.

### Q. Where do you recommend for diving?

A. Sharm el Sheikh is a world renowned dive resort but less well known and far less crowded is Marsa Alam with untouched coral reefs and quick access to the dive sites. Taba and Taba Heights is also good and less crowded than Sharm el Sheikh.

### Q. Where can I go to see Petra?

A. Taba or Taba Heights

### Q. Where can I go to see the Pyramids?

A. any of the resorts, although please note that travel times are typically about 4-5 hours and would normally include an overnight stay in Cairo to give you more time

### Q. Where do you recommend for a chill-out holiday in a decent hotel?

A. Taba Heights is perfect with beautiful scenery, private quiet beaches and high standard hotels. But we also like El Gouna which has a small marina and a few bars and cafes, Dahab for its small town authentic atmosphere and Marsa Alam with a couple of excellent hotels.
